Mountlake Terrace Council Quickens Pace For a Town Center Plan

The Mountlake Terrace City Council approved a revised schedule at its May 18 meeting for completing a Town Center Plan this year.

"Downtown has great potential but it needs help to get there," said Mayor Jerry Smith. "We want to come up with a plan of action that the community supports and that will make a real difference. The thing is we want it sooner, rather than later."

The schedule speeds up an earlier version and calls for a draft plan to be ready in late fall. Community meetings start in July and continue throughout the planning process. More details are posted on the City's website at http://www.cityofmlt.com/news.htm.

"Our Town Center is a diamond in the rough," Councilwoman Angela Amundson said after the meeting. "We are absolutely committed to getting a plan that makes economic sense to vitalize the downtown, but we cannot do it by ourselves. It starts with you, the citizen."

To launch the work plan, Council is holding a special joint meeting with its appointed Planning Commission on June 26, 7:00 pm., at City Hall. The Planning Commission is made up of local citizens who advise the Council on urban planning and development.

Late this year, the Commission will make a recommendation to Council on a final Town Center Plan. That recommendation will be considered by the City Council at a public hearing, probably in December.

Town Center is also known as the main downtown business area of Mountlake Terrace. It is the area along 56th Avenue West between 244th Street Southwest and almost to 228th Street Southwest. At most points, downtown is only 1 block deep, but between 236th Street Southwest and 232nd Street Southwest, it spreads out to 3 blocks deep.

In recent years, downtown had lost business to outside shopping malls and people began writing off the area as ever being a "real downtown." Now, local residents are talking with urgency and excitement about what's possible.
